Jason has been called to serve as provost of Trinity Cathedral in Miami, Florida. His last day with the cathedral is **July 25**. Ken ends his time as our assisting bishop to head back to full-time retirement with the arrival of a new provisional bishop on **August 15**. Join us as we gather to thank these two men for their years of service and wish them the best in the years to come. This farewell reception will include refreshment stations in the narthex and in both corridors on either side of the nave. People will be able to mingle freely in these areas, as well as in the library and outside in Sycamore Commons, while maintaining social distance as needed.



In Concert: Slavic Voices

Slavic Voices presents a special concert with founder and artistic director Ben Flanders and pianist Elena Kholodova, whom Menton’s French magazine called “the brilliant Russian pianist, who impressed the audience with the beauty of the sound and amazing technique.” Featuring music by Russian composers Rachmaninoff and Sviridov, this concert is a meditation on themes of travelling far from home and homesickness, and the universal feelings of alienation that we feel when we are transplanted from our native soil. Admission is free with a suggested donation to support Slavic Voices mission of creating bridges between cultures, raising awareness of Eastern European perspectives, and educating singers and audiences about Slavic languages and cultures. Shred Day at the Cathedral
